#### **CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS**

The City Council's next meeting is a Work/Study Session **Thursday, May 16, 2019** beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Interim City Hall Council Chambers, 6100 219<sup>th</sup> Street SW, Suite 220. - **City Hall & Police Station Addition:** The next Arts Advisory Commission meeting will take place on **May 21, 2019**. The meeting will start at 5 p.m. and take place in the Recreation Pavilion Jungle Room located at 5303 - 228<sup>th</sup> St SW, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043. During the meeting, the commission will discuss the four proposals presented during an April 25, 2019 open house.

## **CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS UPDATES**

- **Evergreen Award Nominations Now Open:** With nice sunny days this past week, the Community Relations Director was out and about taking photos for this year's Evergreen Awards Program. Nominations for our tenth year are open through May 31, 2019 and nomination forms are available online at [www.cityofmlt.com/481](http://www.cityofmlt.com/481). The Evergreen Awards Program builds the community's pride, enhances the community's image, and promotes sustainability. Photo work will continue through the spring and early summer before the properties are judged by city staff.
- **Website Redesign:** Monday, May 6, the City Council was able to preview the city's new website. CivicPlus is currently working on some technical issues and staff is making final edits and adding new photos to the site. The launch is currently planned to occur later this month.
- **Lodging Tax Advisory Committee (LTAC) Meeting:** On May 2, the LTAC had a follow up meeting to review the city's current application and criteria for funding in follow up from their 2018 meetings. The Committee provided feedback to the City Clerk to draft some revised materials for them to review before they meet again. Once the materials are drafted, they will be reviewed by the City Council for approval.
- **National Night Out:** The project team met this week to continue planning for the August 6 event. Plans to finalize the program were made and the city continues to seek sponsors. Current financial sponsors include Premera Blue Cross (our signature sponsor), AFCO & Sons, Edmonds Center for the Arts and Vineyard Park Mountlake Terrace. We also have commitments from area businesses to donate food and supplies for National Night Out. Thanks to our community for your continued support of this event!

## **COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATES**

- **Sound Transit:** Interim temporary parking lot site plan for the former Roger's Market and parking lot is still under review. Sound Transit has resubmitted application materials to achieve a determination of complete application on the site plan proposal. A Conditional Use Permit application review for Sound Transit continues.
- **216<sup>th</sup> Townhomes:** The Planning Commission held a public hearing on Monday, April 8 for a 12-unit/lot townhome development comprised of two 3-story buildings, with six single-family residential units in each. The 0.6 acre lot was previously developed with one single-family home that has since been demolished.
- **Creekside Meadows:** A 56-unit PUD located at 7011 226<sup>th</sup> Pl SW, has resubmitted civil construction plans for review, to be consistent with the preliminary plat and PUD approval received in December 2018.

## **PUBLIC WORKS (ENGINEERING & OPERATIONS) UPDATES**

- **Main Street Construction Update:** Daytime closures on 236<sup>th</sup> St SW and 58<sup>th</sup> Avenue W will continue for the next couple of weeks to allow the contractor to install some large vaults. Both streets will not be closed at the same time and appropriate detours will be in place. Full street closures are allowed between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to approximately 4:00 p.m. The contractor's schedule shows one closure on 58<sup>th</sup> for next week with multiple closures occurring on the following week. The 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue W roadway will remain open to both north and southbound traffic during these closures.

Motorists and pedestrians are reminded to be alert in the construction zone and follow guidance signs and flaggers.

The closure allows the contractor's underground utility work to continue. Installation of the conduits and large vaults has been challenging at street intersections where conduits overlap and connect to the vaults from multiple directions.

Traffic will continue to divert from 236<sup>th</sup> Street SW through the neighborhoods during this period. Community Transit and King County Metro will also continue to operate on detour routes during these daytime hours to minimize delays.

- **Controlling Aquatic Weeds in Lake Ballinger, May 29, 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Mountlake Terrace Senior Community Center 23000 Lakeview Drive:** Lake Ballinger has in recent years become infested with invasive aquatic weeds, including Eurasian watermilfoil, fragrant water lilies and curly leaf pondweed. The thick aquatic plant beds that cover most of the nearshore area have negatively impacted boating, swimming, and fishing in the lake. Invasive weeds have also reduced water quality. In order to address the problem, a citizen steering

committee has recommended a control plan including use of burlap bottom barriers and aquatic herbicide applied to 50 percent of the lake during summer 2019.

This **free, public workshop on Controlling Aquatic Weeds in Lake Ballinger** will cover:

- Revisions to the 2018 aquatic weed control plan (including using a different herbicide and increasing the amount of treatment area in the lake)
- How to control aquatic weeds by hand
- Stopping the spread of aquatic weeds

- **Dog Training Classes:** The Dog Obedience classes are continuously filling and running this year. - **Parks Department Preparing for Summer:** Park staff has begun the process of starting up the ballfield irrigation systems as we head into the summer months. Staff has also started a vigorous mowing schedule and pressure washing aerating and weed control.
- **Earth Day/Arbor Day:** The City of Mountlake Terrace Recreation and Parks Departments held an Earth Day and Arbor Day Volunteer event on Saturday, April 27 at Ballinger Park. More than 50 participants met at the Ballinger Park Clubhouse with gloves and tools in hand.

Members from the City Council, Recreation Park Advisory Commission, the Neighborhood Park Improvement Subcommittee as well as the Mountlake Terrace Ballinger Organic Garden (MLTBOG), the Mountlake Terrace Dog Off-leash Group (MLTDOG), the Mountlake Terrace Senior Center and Plant Amnesty were also on site. Work completed included litter clean up, flowerbed maintenance, garden bed plantings as well as invasive plant removal along Hall Creek and within Ballinger Park. All volunteers were treated to lunch by the City Council and received a free one gallon tree in honor of Arbor Day from the City working with the Conservation District.

- **Ballot Drop Box Relocated:** Park staff worked with the County Elections Office and Sno-Isle Libraries to secure a new location for the Ballot Drop Box at the Civic Campus. The Ballot Drop Box has been moved to a location in a parking island on the west side of the Library Parking lot and is now out of the way of the construction area. The box was moved last week and should be ready for use for the upcoming elections. We will monitor the use this fall to be sure it doesn't conflict with the Library programming.

**Weekly Patrol Synopsis**

- On May 1, 2019 at 10:58 a.m., Animal Control was dispatched to the 23500 block of Lakeview Drive for an animal complaint. It was reported that a vehicle drove over a flock of geese seriously injuring one. When confronted about the wounded goose, the driver then drove over the goose again to make sure it was deceased, then fled the scene. Investigation is ongoing.



- On May 1, 2019 at 12:02 p.m. Officers responded to the 5900 block of 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. for a disturbance. It was reported that a driver of a vehicle passing through the construction zone got into a verbal altercation with a flagger.
- On May 1, 2019, a Mountlake Terrace officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation at the 21000 block of 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. The driver of the vehicle had a warrant for their arrest. They were arrested and booked on their warrant.
- On May 2, 2019 in the evening, officers responded to the Studio Six Motel for an unwanted person. Officers contacted that person and issued them a no trespass order per the request of the hotel management.
- On May 2, 2019 Officers responded to a rollover collision at the 5200 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW. During the investigation it was determined that the driver was intoxicated. The intoxicated driver was extremely agitated and uncooperative with officers. They were medically cleared and eventually booked for DUI.
- On May 2, 2019 at 12:21 a.m., Mountlake Terrace Officers were dispatched to a rollover single-car collision at the 5200 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW. When officers arrived they found the vehicle on its roof and noticed a single female occupant sitting on the ground outside the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle had apparent injuries and also showed indications of alcohol intoxication. The driver was transported to Swedish Edmonds Hospital where she was treated for her injuries. After the driver was cleared from the hospital she was booked into the Snohomish County Jail for DUI.
- On May 2, 2019, it was reported during a counseling session that a client threatened to kill several people. The threats were specific in nature. The listed people have been notified and the investigation is ongoing.
- On May 2, 2019 officers responded to a hit and run collision at the 22800 block of 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. A parked vehicle was struck and the suspect vehicle fled the area.
- On May 2, 2019 it was reported that a vehicle was stolen from the 21400 block of 48<sup>th</sup> on April 26, 2019. The registered owner stated that he did not originally want the police involved because he has some criminal history. The victim eventually got the police involved and gave some suspect information. Investigation is ongoing.
- On May 2, 2019 Officers responded to an assault. It was reported that several subjects were drinking at the Getaway Tavern when they became agitated with each other over some jealousy issues.
- On May 3, 2019 Mountlake Terrace High School administration approached our School Resource Officer about two non-students on school property. Trespass notices were issued.

### **CODE ENFORCEMENT PROPERTY OF THE WEEK**

On April 4, 2019, Code Enforcement followed up to a complaint involving multiple vehicles parked on unimproved surfaces, located near the 5200 block of 220<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Code Enforcement verified the complaint and issued a civil notice of violation in accordance with 8.15.050.B.3 – (All motor vehicles shall be parked on an improved surface anywhere on a property, or on a maintained surface. No more than two motor vehicles may be parked in the rear yard of a residence unless contained in a legal and fully enclosed structure). On April 30, 2019, Code Enforcement returned to the location, and noted all vehicles had been removed from unimproved surfaces.
